## 2. Managing pain

- An ice pack or cold compress over the eye can help. (Try putting ice cubes or a bag of frozen peas in a sealed, clean plastic bag.) Use this as often as possible for 24-28 hours after surgery. Hold over the eye for 3-5 minutes, take a break, and repeat.
- Read the Managing your child's pain handout for more information.

### 3. Prescription

If your surgeon prescribes eye drops, pick them up from your pharmacy. Follow the instructions on the bottle.

#### 4. Diet

· Your child can eat and drink as normal.

#### 5. Bathing

· Avoid getting water in the eyes for 1 month after surgery.
